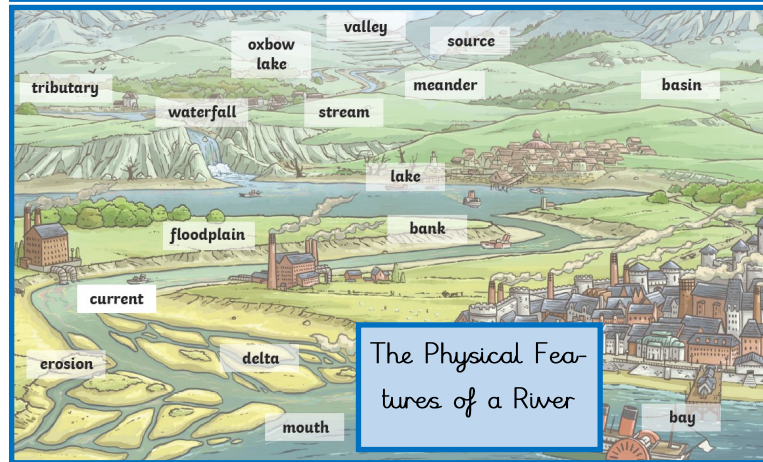
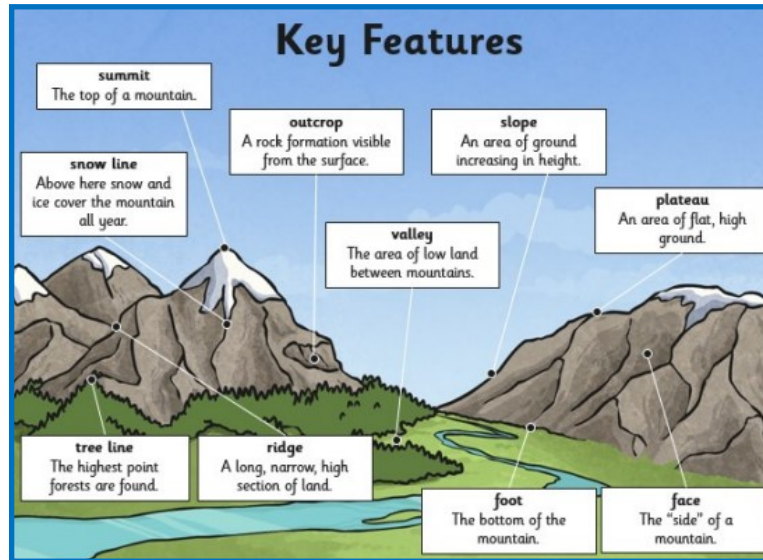


Biodiversity	A variety of living things in one given place.
Climate Change	Climate change is when there is a large difference in normal climate patterns over a long period of time.
Flooding	An excess of water in a river that overflows its banks.
Hemisphere	The northern and southern halves of the world, split by the equator.
Mountain	A mountain is a landform that rises high above surrounding land. They are higher than 600m. Anything less is considered a hill.
Natural Resources	Natural materials in an area that can be used or sold (timber or stone for example).
River	A river is a flowing stream of water. Usually they feed into an ocean, lake, pond or occasionally, another river.
Source	The point at which a river starts.
Sustainability	Resources being used in a way which means they will continue to be available in the future.
Tectonic Plate	Pieces of the rocky outer layer of the Earth's crust.
Tourism	When people travel and visit areas for pleasure.
Water Cycle	The journey water takes from the land, to the sky and back again.
