Key Vocabulary

Bark	Bark is the outermost layers of stems and roots of woody plants. Plants with bark include trees, woody vines, and shrubs
Forest	a thick growth of trees and underbrush covering an extensive tract of land
Wood	is a small thick group of trees that grow close together
Ocean	a very large expanse of sea, in particular each of the main areas into which the sea is divided geographically
River	a large natural stream of water flowing in a channel to the sea, a lake, or another river
Continent	any of the world's main continuous expanses of land (Europe, Asia, Africa, North and South America, Australia, Antarctica)
Deciduous	(of a tree or shrub) shedding its leaves annually
Evergreen	a plant that retains green leaves throughout the year
Map	a pictorial representation of a place
Atlas	a book full of maps from around the world
