- The characteristics of different countries and regions very significantly, including weather, land use and flora and fauna.





Climate Zones

Climate Zones are areas with distinct climates, which occur on lines of latitude.

A climate zone results from the climate conditions of an area: its temperature, humidity, amount and type of precipitation, and the season. A climate zone is reflected in a region's natural vegetation.

Biomes and Ecosystems

An **ecosystem** describes a specific area where organisms work together as a unit. It could be any size from a tiny pool of water to hundreds of square miles of desert.

A biome is way to describe a large group of similar ecosystems. Biomes have similar weather, rainfall, animals, and plants. There are a number of biomes on planet Earth.
